- \*Solve parenting time concerns and issues
- \*Develop parenting time plans and/or schedules
- \*Learn how to communicate with the other parent about your children
- \*Learn about child-related issues through education
- \*Learn co-parenting techniques and strategies
- \*Refer to other services when appropriate

**How Long Will It Take?** A case manager will meet with you immediately following court. The staff can work with both parents through telephone calls and meetings to address your concerns.

**How Do I Enroll?** Tell the judge, prosecutor, or any court staff member that you wish to meet with someone from **The Access Program**.

**Does It Cost Anything?** No. The service is provided at no cost to you.

**Who Is Eligible For Services?** All services are provided without regard to race, ethnicity, age, religion, sex, disability, national origin, ancestry, or status as a veteran.
